My plan is to work diligently over the next four years to keep our community as beautiful and prosperous, as it always has been. I would like to personally thank you, each and every resident of our village, for your continued support. You are what makes this community so special and vibrant! As always, I would also like to thank the employees, trustees, committee members and public officers who work hard every day to keep our community safe and running seamlessly. In our Department of Public Works, Dave Laney, Tom Mikoljczyk, and Eric Carlsen continue to work hard keeping the village clean of debris and yard waste, planting flowers and maintaining our parks. These are only a few of their day to day tasks, but these qualities are vital to Oakfield's success and beauty. Triangle Park looked great for our Memorial Day parade and ceremony! I look forward to working with all of you over the next few years with a main goal in mind; keeping this community beautiful and prosperous.

Some changes to the Village Clerks office will be taking place. Our current Village Clerk/Treasurer, Joyce Grazioplene, will be retiring June 1<sup>st</sup>. Although we will be sad to see her retire we are beyond happy for her. On behalf of myself and the Trustees, congratulations and thank you, Joyce, for your many years of dedication! The Board of Trustees has appointed a replacement Clerk/Treasurer who we believe will be an asset to this community and Village Office. Andrew Maguire will be taking over Joyce's duties as of June 1<sup>st</sup>. His enthusiasm and financial background should make for a smooth transition. Our Deputy Clerk, Michelle Bartholomew, will remain in her duties as an instrumental part of the Village Office.

We also have some community update. Our new water tank is near complete and should be solely operational by mid-June. Currently, we are in the process of painting the tank in blue. The upgrade to our new

500,000 gallon tank will poise us for the future and provide residents with more efficient water levels, increased pressure and flow. There have been countless hours spent on cost analysis for this project. We have decided the most logical and cost effective way to move forward is a low cost addition to our water usage fee. The standard user fee for Water and Sewer will increase monthly by \$5 (or quarterly from \$25 a quarter to \$40). This will ensure that any burden is split equally amongst our users. As many of you know, our old water tower has had more than a few issues in past years. As it is a symbol of our community and tradition, it is sad to say that we have begun reviewing bids for its demolition. We are looking to begin demolition by mid-summer. With our new, more efficient water tower, the community, as a whole, will benefit in this transition. We thank you for your patience and look forward to the completion of these projects.

As a reminder, please be courteous to your neighbors and the people of this community. With summer right around the corner, kids will be out of school and very active throughout the community. Please be sure to abide by all safety and traffic laws and be aware of your surroundings. If you have pets, please pick up and dispose of their waste properly, and be mindful of excessive barking. Let's all work together on keeping the Village of Oakfield clean and safe like it has been in the years past.

On a final note, we remembered the brave men and women who have fought and served for our country this Memorial Day. We could not have asked for better weather as our parade went off without a hitch. I would like to thank previous Mayor, Ray Cianfrini, for speaking on my behalf, and everyone else in attendance at Triangle Park on this wonderful day. Without recognition of these brave veterans, The United States of America would not be the country it is today. I hope you all have a safe and happy summer!
